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The Chair of the Security Council Committee pursuant to resolutions 1267 (1999) and 1989 (2011) concerning Al-Qaida and associated individuals and entities presents his compliments to the Permanent Representatives and Observers to the United Nations and wishes to convey the following:

On **10 July 2015**, the Committee enacted the **amendments** specified with strikethrough and underline in the entry below on its List (the Al-Qaida Sanctions List) of individuals and entities subject to the assets freeze, travel ban and arms embargo set out in paragraph 1 of Security Council resolution 2161 (2014) adopted under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations:
